UND lauds new federal law on

Air Traffic Control hiring practices

For the past two years, Paul Drechsel, assistant chair for the University of North Dakota Air Traffic Control Program, has been on a mission to make the road to becoming an air traffic controller (ATC) a little less bumpy.

That's why Drechsel, an associate professor of aviation at UND's John D. Odegard School of Aerospace Sciences, is lauding recently signed legislation out of Congress. The new law reverses federal aviation hiring policies that, in a sense, would have diminished a degree from certified ATC training institution such as UND.

In June, the Government Accountability Office found that the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) transitioned to its new hiring policies without the proper implementation and planning

among other concerns.

The new FAA reauthorization bill, signed by President Obama last month, alters ATC hiring processes launched in 2014. The new legislation breaks down job openings for aspiring controllers into two separate pools. One pool includes applicants who have successfully completed ATC training from an approved institution, such as UND, or eligible veterans.

“That is very important,” Drechsel said. “Instead of ATC jobs being open to anybody, it now signifies that our degree is very important for these students to have an opportunity to become employed.”

The other pool holds individuals who apply under a vacancy announcement from the FAA. Because of this, UND graduates looking to secure a career in ATC now have a distinct advantage when pursuing a job as a controller.

The FAA will open its next hiring bid from Aug. 8-15, and the revamped policies are included for this new round of hires.

Another change that UND officials are happy about is that the FAA is no longer allowed to use biographical assessments to determine hiring eligibility.

Before the change, the biographical assessments comprised a number of survey questions unrelated to one’s actual education or training to be a successful air traffic controller.

“Now we’re taking individuals who have been trained and have a degree in ATC management and know what the job entails,” Drechsel said. “They’ve done hands-on simulation training in order to acquire the skills needed to successfully manage air traffic.”

Direct impacts

When the FAA implemented the new hiring practices in 2014, Drechsel contacted North Dakota’s Congressional Delegation and

explained its shortcomings and direct impacts to students and institutions such as UND.

“Without their help, none of this could have changed,” Drechsel said. “So I really want to commend our Delegation and their staff for a lot of the work they’ve done.”

U.S. Sen. John Hoeven said UND’s program does an outstanding job preparing students to become highly qualified Air Traffic Controllers.

“We worked to advance this legislation because it takes an important step forward in addressing problems with the FAA’s hiring process by ensuring that graduates of FAA certified Collegiate Training Initiatives schools like UND get the opportunity they deserve.”

The new FAA bill had a range of other important provisions for UND including language that reauthorized the UND-based Northern Plains Unmanned Aircraft Systems Test Site and six other UAS test sites for three more years, according to Hoeven.

‘Burdensome, abrupt’

U.S. Sen. Heidi Heitkamp said the FAA reauthorization bill fixed burdensome requirements for small aircraft pilots in North Dakota and UND aviation students.

“We can build the infrastructure our state needs to support a growing and thriving population, and we can do it by supporting the extensive training programs at UND through a streamlined hiring process to create a strong air traffic control workforce for years to come,” Heitkamp said.

U.S. Rep. Kevin Cramer had conversations with FAA Administrator Michael Huerta about the abrupt changes and alleged impropriety in the ATC hiring process in addition to asking for an FAA investigation. He also co-sponsored several bills addressing the ATC hiring issue.

“I was concerned about the FAA’s lack of transparency in changing its hiring process with so little advance notice or explanation,” said Cramer. “It especially impacted students like those at UND planning to pursue an ATC career with the FAA.”


June 30 retirement reception honors Lana Rakow

U.S. Department of Health and Human Services awards UND \$10.7 million for infectious disease research

New federal COBRE grant recognizes UND's biomedical science capabilities

Recognizing the already notable reputation of University of North Dakota's biomedical research enterprise, the federal government just authorized a \$10.7 million grant to a group of scientists based at UND's [School of Medicine and Health Sciences \(SMHS\)](#) to dig deeper into the many questions surrounding infectious agents.

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services five-year

grant is named “Center for Excellence in Host-Pathogen Interactions.” The named principal investigators are David Bradley, Malak Kotb and Brij Singh, all of the SMHS. The grant is one of several so-called “COBRE” grants awarded recently. COBRE is an acronym for [Centers of Biomedical Research Excellence](#).

“The objective of this COBRE grant is to gain further understanding of devastating infectious diseases including lung infections, neuro-inflammation and parasitic diseases,” said Singh, a Chester Fritz Distinguished Professor of Biomedical Sciences at SMHS.

Five other SMHS scientists will work collaboratively on this COBRE research program (in alphabetical order): Catherine Brissette, Xuesong Chen, Bibhuti Mishra, Jyotika Sharma and Min Wu.

Students are also an important part of this grant as several will be working alongside each of the SMHS scientists named.

Level playing field

The COBRE program was designed by the National Institutes of Health (NIH) to cultivate research expertise among junior faculty and strengthen the research infrastructure of states that do not receive as much NIH funding as some larger states.

“This COBRE award complements the two other COBRE grants currently active at UND and the SMHS, and will be a powerful engine to speed the development of further discoveries that can be applied at the bedside to help patients with infectious disease,” said Dr. Joshua Wynne, UND vice president for health affairs and dean of the SMHS. “We are extremely proud of all of our faculty members who are part of this wonderful award.”

“This is a major coup for UND and a clear testament to the confidence that the Department of Health and Human Services in our research capabilities,” said Grant McGimpsey, UND vice

president of [research and economic development](#).

“This also shows the high impact research that is done by investigators at the School of Medicine and UND,” Singh said.

This COBRE follows two others recently renewed for research projects at UND’s SMHS:

- [COBRE](#) Center for Neurodegenerative Disorder Research, \$26 million
- COBRE Epigenetics Bioinformatics Core, \$10.7 million

Legacy of funding

In 2002, the UND SMHS received a \$10.4-million, five-year award from the NIH to establish a nationally recognized COBRE.

That grant was renewed in 2007 for another five years at 10.1 million, and in 2012 for another five years at 5.1 million.

UND’s COBRE funding supports collaborative projects promoting research opportunities for biomedical investigators in North Dakota. These projects offer broad potential for understanding and treating pathophysiological and neurodegenerative diseases, and also provided funds to establish Imaging and Mass Spectrometry facilities.

Additionally, UND SMHS has received an [“INBRE”](#) grant—also recently renewed—for \$13 million. It’s of NIH’s IDeA program, an effort to expand North Dakota’s research foundation by funding basic, clinical and translational research; faculty development; and infrastructure improvements.

In total, the UND SMHS biomedical research enterprise has current COBRE and INBRE grants totaling close to \$45 million.

Students will teach English to Germans in Germany for the U.S. Fulbright Program

Amy Shirek and Ashley Schomer, both students at the University of North Dakota, are headed for Germany to help teach English to young German students for 10 months as part of the Fulbright Teaching Assistantship (ETA) in Germany.

They'll depart in September.

The ETA falls under the Fulbright U.S. Student Program. There are programs in countries all around the world; however Shirek and Schomer were selected for Germany. The program is designed to help bridge gaps and build understanding between the United States and other countries and cultures.

ETA Programs will place the UND Fulbrighters in classrooms to provide assistance to local English teachers. Shirek and Schomer will help teach English language while serving as cultural ambassadors for the U.S. They will be cooperating with the teachers and schools in Germany to develop lessons about the English language and incorporate aspects of American history and culture, along with interests of the students into the classroom.

In addition to teaching, they'll find ways to be involved with their host communities, including participating in after-school study groups or language clubs. Germany has a long history with the Fulbright program and also has a Diversity Program, which places a portion of the ETAs in schools with significant numbers of students with minority backgrounds.

“Because of my background in English Language Learner (ELL) education and because of the current refugee crisis in Germany, I am hoping to be placed in one of these schools where I feel I can do the most good,” Shirek said.

Germany visit

Shirek was born and raised in Grand Forks and is the second youngest of five children in her family.

“All of my older siblings studied German at some point, and that was what initially got me interested in the language,” says Shirek .

Through her four years in high school, Shirek studied German, and she also traveled abroad with the German American Partnership Program (GAPP) during her sophomore year.

“That trip was a definite motivator for me and was part of what pushed me to study German and education at UND,” says Shirek.

After the Fulbright experience in Germany, Shirek plans to come back to Grand Forks and complete her education degree. She eventually would like to get a job teaching in Grand Forks.

“I am very thankful for this opportunity and look forward to making the most of my time in Germany,” says Shirek.

Second try

Schomer, a native of East Grand Forks, is preparing for a similar experience abroad.

A spring 2014 graduate of UND with a bachelor’s degree in German, Schomer is a licensed K-12 German teacher in North Dakota. She is currently working on her master’s degree in ELL education at UND.

The application for the Fulbright opportunity was an arduous process, involving a lot of paperwork as well as two essays. Other steps in the process include on-campus committee interviews on campus and language clearances that Fulbright applicants must pass.

Schomer says she was actually rejected the first time she applied in fall of 2013. But She was undaunted and gave it another shot.

“I am beyond thankful to everyone who helped me apply the first and second time,” describes Schomer. “From my experience, I have learned that the worst thing that someone can say in this situation, is ‘no.’”

Schomer pursued a Fulbright opportunity in Germany because of her undergraduate major and a desire to live in the country for an extended period of time.

“If anyone thinks that they want to do something like this, they should definitely try it,” Schomer said. “You may have the chance at a once-in-a-life-time experience.”

**NSF support helps students
continue grad school
education, solve real-world**

problems in the process

University of North Dakota graduate student Leslie Yellow Hammer is buzzing with excitement – or perhaps that’s just the bees.

Yellow Hammer studies in UND’s [Department of Biology](#) and recently was named recipient of a 2016 [National Science Foundation Graduate Research Fellowship Program](#) (GRFP), which provides support to graduate students pursuing research-based master’s or doctoral degrees in the fields of science, technology, engineering and math.

“I knew early on I wanted to earn my Ph.D., and so I toured the UND Biology Department as part of the U.S. MASTERS program,” said Yellow Hammer, who is a member of member of the Standing Rock Sioux Tribe in south-central North Dakota. “And, it just struck a chord with me.”

Two for the show

Yellow Hammer is not alone on the UND campus when it comes to her excitement. That’s because UND actually has two NSF research fellows this year.

Alec Redmann, who studied in UND’s Mechanical Engineering Department, also was notified that he will be receiving GRFP support. He graduated from UND last May, and now is planning to attend the University of Wisconsin- Madison.

“Ever since I was in high school, and even before that, I was always interested in science and math. I enjoyed taking things apart and putting them back together,” said Redmann, a native

of Jamestown, N.D. “What really made me consider mechanical engineering at a college level was calculus during my senior year of high school. Seeing the problems you can solve and using what you learned to solve real-world problems was something I was very interested in learning more about.”

Bee habitats

As for Yellow Hammer, her research is helping to solve real-world problems in North Dakota, where she says there’s little long-standing native bee pollination data. She says that combined with a worldwide decline in bees and pollinators has led her to use the GRFP support to research the intersection of prairie grassland ecology and the impacts different habitats have on pollinators in the state.

“North Dakota is the national leader in honey production using domestic honeybees,” Yellow Hammer said. “So it’s really important to know that we have quality habitat, not only to sustain the domestic honeybees, but also our native pollinators. If we don’t have adequate and healthy habitat, we could see a loss in our native pollinators, which isn’t good for agriculture and native plants.”

She’ll generate her data by looking at 10 sites in Grand Forks County and gauge how the management of those sites – grazed or not-grazed – and human involvement with them helps, hurts or doesn’t change pollinator populations.

While Yellow Hammer’s research will be the first to look at pollinators in this area of the state, it comes as a natural extension of the work she’s been doing for the past five years at UND’s Grassland Ecology Lab. While there, she has worked with UND biologists Kathryn Yurkonis, Brett Goodwin and Brian Darby and other graduate and undergraduate students to better understand prairie and grassland ecosystems.

“I was always interested in the environment,” Yellow Hammer said. “I’m very interested in how our impacts as humans, and

how our activities change the environment. Many people know there's a lot of negative impacts but wonder, 'how can we mitigate those?'"

Arduous process

NSF student research fellowship awardees are chosen from close to 17,000 applicants who represent a diverse group of scientific disciplines and from all states, the District of Columbia, and U.S. commonwealths and territories. The more recently group includes 1,077 women, 424 individuals from underrepresented minority groups, 62 persons with disabilities, 35 veterans and 627 senior undergraduates.

GRFP provides three years of financial support within a five-year fellowship period (\$34,000 annual stipend and \$12,000 cost-of-education allowance to the graduate institution). That support is for graduate study that leads to a research-based master or doctoral degree in science or engineering.

Since 1952, NSF has provided fellowships to individuals selected early in their careers based on their demonstrated potential for significant achievements in science and engineering. GRFP is critical to NSF's overall strategy of developing the globally engaged workforce necessary to ensure the nation's leadership in advancing science and engineering research and innovation.

For the application, applicants had to write two different essays. The first essay being personal, such as talking about what inspired you to pursue graduate school, and the second essay was writing a research proposal. Applicants needed to be capable of posing an issue and thinking through the entire research project. Besides the essays, applicants had to have five letters of recommendation.

"The application process was incredibly difficult," said Redmann. "The application was due at the end of October and I had started working on it in May (2015). Finishing the

application was an achievement in itself.”

Curbing waste

Redmann, who currently works at LM Wind Power in Grand Forks as an engineer, wrote about using natural fibers during the manufacturing of wind turbine blades. Right now, glass fiber is being used for blades and once those blades are old they are sent to a landfill, which generates a lot of waste. He proposed using natural fibers, such as flax to better the environment.

Redmann said there were two people in the UND community who helped him greatly throughout the whole process: Joan Hawthorne, director of assessment and regional accreditation, was of great assistance during the application process; and his advisor, Associate Dean/Associate Professor of Mechanical Engineering Matt Cavalli also was very helpful.

Yellow Hammer says she, too, was fortunate to receive strong mentorship and support, especially from Yurkonis, other professors, older students and educational programs at UND, such as the McNair Scholarship and the U.S. MASTERS program. She also says that the Standing Rock community has supported her as she works to further her education.

“This fellowship has opened important doors for me,” Yellow Hammer said. “I’ve benefited from a lot of outreach myself and I definitely want to give back. I’m a bit sad to leave this chapter of my life here but, I’ll come back and everything will be different.”

Student Managed Investment Fund takes first place at international competition

The Student Managed Investment Fund took first place recently at the International Global Asset Management Education competition in New York City.

The group placed first in two categories: bond portfolio and alternative funds. While they have placed first in bond portfolio once before, it was their first time winning in the alternative category.

The group, which has about 35 members, invests real money into a variety of portfolios. This year, they were allotted \$1.3 million for investments. It is one of the only fully student-run investment fund groups in the nation and is an opportunity only available to business students in the UND College of Business & Public Administration.

The competition hosted 147 schools from 47 different states and 39 countries.

Other UND students also placed at the conference.

Evan Romuld, Grand Forks, a computer science major, placed third out of 75 teams in an entrepreneurship challenge.

"I had to create a business that improved a process of service like Uber did. That's the example they used," Romuld said. "My business was to laser-measure motorcycle helmets so it's a better fitting helmet. . . [that's] better for safety."

Mitch Hersch, Mandan, N.D., a managerial finance and accountancy major, made it to the top 10 in corporate finance business simulation.

Social science programs include classes in anthropology, communications, economics, history, political science, psychology and sociology. The subplans will consist of *Health and Human Services* (pathway intended for nursing, OT and PT) and *Economic and Political Science Studies* (pathway intended for majors from CoBPA such as entrepreneurship, management and marketing).

The College of Arts & Sciences, in conjunction with the UND Student Success Center, has been working to provide pathway plans for students who are not being admitted to certain programs after completing many credits at UND. These avenues are meant for students to be able to complete their degree at UND and still remain in their areas of interest. Because of

this effort, students are requested to double major with social science and any degree OTHER than those listed as counting toward the social science degree.
